Sutherland Community Garden, Diane Warren Kindness Lounge, and Ram Head Fountain

The Sutherland Community Garden features a plinth lawn emphasizing Western views of the front-range. Sculptures donated by Tom and Jean Sutherland; created by CSU alumnus Pard Morrison. The Ram Head Fountain is an updated version that features three of the original hand-carved Ram Heads from the 1962 version. The Diane Warren Kindness Lounge is a favorite student gathering spot with its fireplace, seating, and view of the new plinth lawn.

Research Wall

Level 300's research wall highlights Colorado State University researchers, projects, awards, events, and funders on a rotating basis in photo slideshows and research videos. It serves to showcase the research, artistry, talent, and accomplishments of CSU faculty and students. Each of four art panels is inspired by a step in scientific methods and in the creative process as depicted by CSU graphic design professor John Gravadahl, who chose to highlight the scientific methods with minimalist imagery, allowing viewers to creatively interpret the work themselves.

At 15,000 sq. ft. our Grand Ballroom is the largest in Northern Colorado and can split into four separate ballrooms, each with its own audiovisual booth and projectors. The curtain-free, floor-to-ceiling Electrochromatic West-facing glass wall dims or brightens based on natural light from the outdoors. The spectacular West-facing view is a Northern Colorado must-see.



Level 100, 200, and 300

Each of seven water fountains throughout the Re•vitalized LSC, displays quotes from many of Colorado State's distinguished Presidents and Vice Presidents. Mary Ontiveros, CSU's first Vice President of Diversity, will have a quote installed in the LSC Theatre's water fountain later in 2015.

This updated campus pub will feature a microbrewery and College of Health and Human Sciences classroom focused on the study of fermentation. The classroom is dedicated by children of CSU Alumnus Irving Brown, and will be named in his memory.

Signature Ram Head, Ram Welcome Wall, East West Corridor

This prominent hallway faces East to West from the building's main entrance on the East and signifies the CSU student journey from orientation to graduation and beyond. Upon entering the main building, **look up** to encounter the Signature Ram Head floating above. Next, notice the Ram Welcome wall (across from Campus Information), that displays photos from the last four years of entering first year and transfer students. Photos rotate each year so students can find themselves throughout four years at CSU. On clear days, the building's open architectural design allows viewing of the "A" through its West entrance, which also will boast an "Alumni Wall" in the future.

Venetian Glass Tiled Main Staircase

The original CSU Plaza as designed in the 1960s was an emulation of Italy's St. Mark's square. That design extends into the Lory Student Center's original Venetian glass tiles on the three-story main staircase (which portrays every color shown throughout the original LSC in 1962). This milestone was preserved during Re•vitalization, and serves as a point of reference for visitors past and present.

Lincoln Mural and Land-Grant Wall

The Morrill Act, groundbreaking legislation by President Abraham Lincoln in 1862, created the nation's land-grant university system. CSU, Colorado's only land-grant institution, celebrated the Act's 150th anniversary in 2012. The Lincoln and Land-Grant Walls pay tribute to this act and Colorado State's history.

Associated Students of Colorado State University Senate Chamber

Serves as the home of the ASCSU Senate with state-of-the-art technology to serve a variety of student organization and campus department needs. The updated venue was inspired by elements of legislative chambers at the state capitol.

Curfman and Duhesa Galleries

Named after respected exhibition designer and CSU professor John H. (Jack) Curfman, the updated space includes a light-filled two story design and second floor observation deck, with additional exhibition space to the west. The Duhesa Gallery focuses on Native American art, perfect for CSU's historical roots.

LSC Theatre

Renovated in 2012 and designed to be seamless with the Re•vitalized LSC, this awe-inspiring venue boasts wood walls reminiscent of Colorado's mountainscape, retractable seats to create banquet or stadium-style seating, and an open lobby with views of the Sutherland Community Garden, plinth lawn, and some of Colorado's finest scenery.
